08 Perform appropriate drag and carry techniques to move a casualty to cover.					
09 Demonstrate consolidation and triage of casualties at a Casualty Collection Point.					
10 Properly apply limb and junctional tourniquet(s) on a casualty who has massive bleeding. (M)assive Hemorrhage					
11 Properly pack a wound, apply a pressure bandage, and stop massive bleeding.					
12 Pack a junctional hemorrhage (neck, axillary, inguinal) to stop massive bleeding.					
13 Demonstrate the application of an injectable hemostatic agent (if applicable).					
14 Demonstrate the application of a wound closure device (if applicable).					
15 Use the appropriate method to open the airway. (A)irway					
16 NPA and/or extraglottic airway.					
17 Use one-handed and two-handed Bag Valve Mask ventilation techniques.					
18 Perform a cricothyroidotomy in Tactical Field Care.					
19 Measure respiratory rate. (R)espiration					





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20 Apply a vented chest seal.				
21 Assess for Tension Pneumothorax				
22 Perform a single or bilateral needle decompression(s) of the chest (NDC).				
23 Assess for hemorrhagic shock. (C)irculation				
24 Assess for pelvic fracture and apply pelvic compression device				
25 Convert/Replace tourniquets				
26 Obtain IV/IO access to fluid resuscitate or infuse medications.				
27 Administration of blood products.				
28 Prevent and treat hypothermia (active and passive external warming) in a casualty. (H)ypothermia				
29 Identify and assess head injuries. (H)ead				
30 Identify an eye injury and apply a rigid eyeshield.				
31 Perform a rapid field test of visual acuity.				
32 Administer pain medications and antibiotics. (P)ain/(A)ntibiotics				
33 Administer medications via various routes such as oral, sublingual, transmucosal buccal, intranasal, intramuscular, intravenous and intraosseous.				
34 Inspect, assess, and dress wounds and burns. (W)ounds				
35 Demonstrate the application of open abdominal, impalement, and amputation wound dressings.				
36 Classify burns and calculate burn surface area.				
37 Splint any fractures on a casualty. (S)plint				
38 Measure carotid, radial, femoral, tibial, and pedal pulses.				
39 Demonstrate assessment of pulse oximetry and electronic vital signs monitoring.				
40 Assess and document a casualty's mental status using the Alert, Verbal, Pain, Unresponsive method.				
41 Assess and treat Traumatic Cardiac Arrest with bilateral NDC
